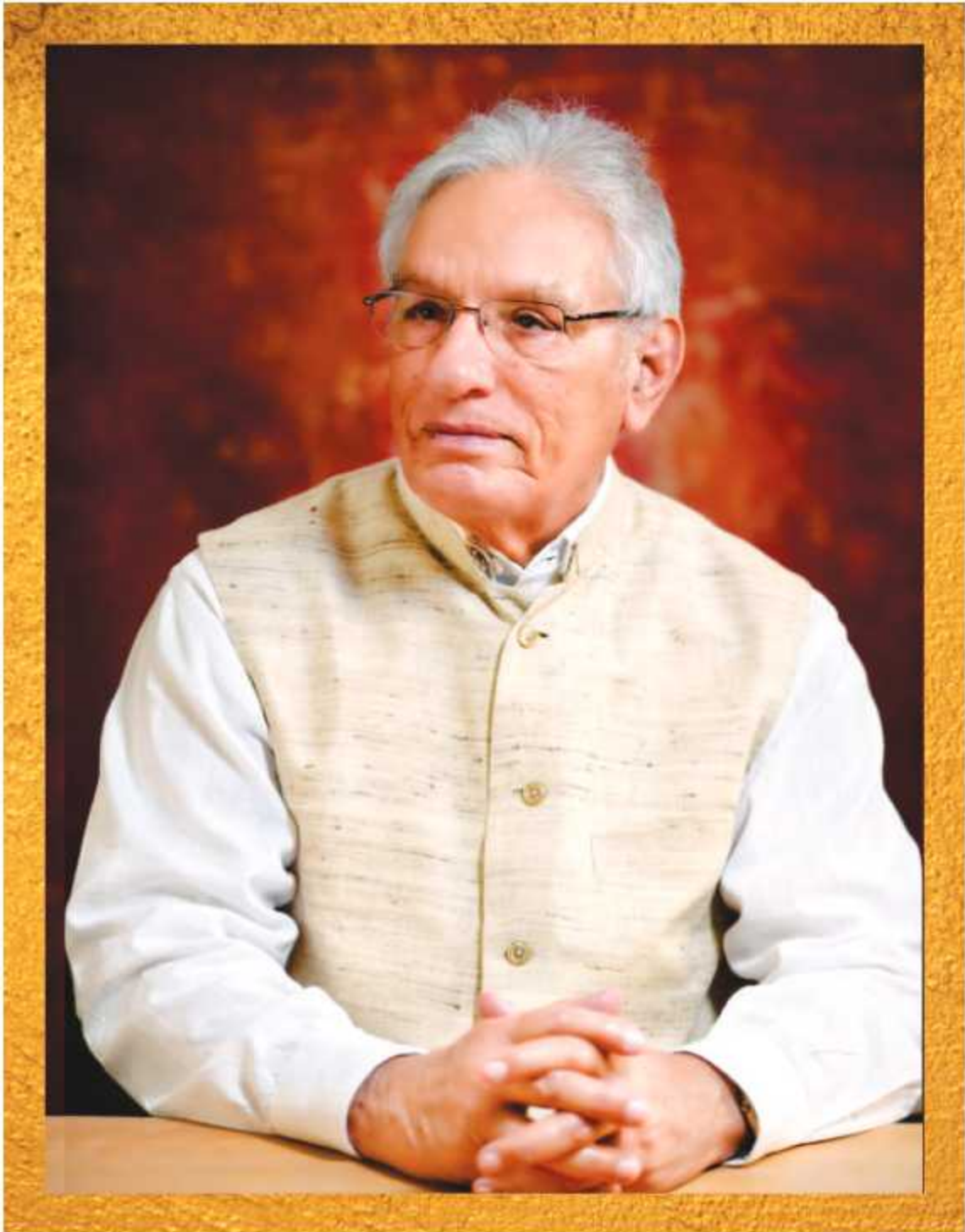

The database of the library collection can be accessed by the user through Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) using the software. OPAC enables searching through clusters like Author, Subject, Title, Keyword, class, Publisher, Place of Publication and so on. It also uses Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology for efficient management of library services and convenience of users.

Fully Wifi enabled and equipped with latest ICT facilities. 7 computers with printers and scanners The library also features a Book Bank for economically weaker students.

Dear Club, a special club of the library provides an opportunity to young readers to participate in mind stimulating activities and inculcate in them a habit and love for reading. The most voracious reader is given a special prize at the Annual Prize distribution function.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

– Become a part of the Largest Uniformed Voluntary Youth Organisation

The College has NCC (Army Wing) under 1 CHD Girls Battalion, Chandigarh which consists of an enrolled strength of 104 cadets trained under the able guidance of their ANO Lt Kesu Singh (Best ANO in the country 2022-23). The students who take up NCC and become NCC cadets can dream of a promising career in the armed forces as they are trained and groomed for regular commission in the army and paramilitary forces.

RULES

1. NCC is of three years' duration and the cadets have to attend at least one camp to be eligible for B certificate exam and two camps for C certificate exam.
2. NCC cadets must attend the parade regularly with a minimum 75% attendance record.

INCENTIVES

1. The college awards fee concession to the best NCC volunteer.
2. NCC 'C' Certificate with 'A' or 'B' grade gives the following benefits to the cadets
 - Preference in recruitment of State Police Force, Army, Navy and Air Force.
 - Exemption from written exam CDS examination conducted by UPSC
 - 10–15 bonus marks in paramilitary forces recruitment i.e. BSF, CISF, CRPF, SSB.
 - Written exam will be waived off for the post of Soldier GD.
3. Adventure opportunities for cadets through Rock Climbing and mountaineering camps, shooting camps.
4. Extensive exposure and growth opportunities by attending National level camps like All India Leadership Training, Republic Day Camp, National Exchange Programme, etc. which may be held in different states of India and International camps under Youth Exchange Program.



NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The college has two units of NSS consisting of 200 volunteers. The students of all classes are eligible for enrolment in NSS. The volunteers are required to put in 120 hours of work during the session and attend NSS camps for which certificates are awarded to them.

OBJECTIVES

To enrich the students personality and deepen their understanding of the social environment in which they live.

Eligibility for Admission to B.A.-1st Semester

2. College Colour (Cultural and Co-curricular activities) will be given to students who win 1st and 2nd position in Zonal Youth Festival.

c) SPORTS

1. In sports, Roll of Honour will be awarded for standing 1st in Inter-University/National games and participation in International Events.
2. Sports College Colour will be awarded to students who win 1st, 2nd and 3rd position at P.U. Inter-College Level.
3. Best Athlete of the college will be awarded the College Colour.

APPLICATION FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

HOW TO APPLY?

- The application for fee concession should be submitted on a prescribed form available with Scholarship In-charge at the time of admission and must be attached to the admission form. No such application shall be entertained later on.
- The applicants for fee concession shall be interviewed along with their parents by the Principal on the notified dates.
- Students belonging to the Scheduled tribes/Castes, other Backward Classes Minorities and Financially Disadvantaged can collect application forms of Government of India/Sate Government Scholarship from the Scholarship In-charge and submit them duly completed within one week from the date of admission.
- Fee concession, stipends and scholarships of all the categories are liable to be withdrawn if a student deteriorates in studies/remains irregular in attendance, or is found guilty of misbehaviour.
- Tuition fee concession will be granted to brilliant students, and those belonging to economically weaker section. Students intending to seek the concession are required to enclose all the required documents along with the admission form so that the cases can be decided right at the time of admission. They are required to submit an affidavit along with the admission form and if any document is found to be false or any information found to be concealed, their admission will be cancelled.
- On shifting from one course to another, a student if granted tuition fee concession on the basis mentioned above in the former course will not be entitled to claim the said concession in the latter course as a matter of right i.e. in the latter course it would depend upon the availability of the concession.

Incentives

- 25 most needy and meritorious students will be offered concessional education throughout the year as per the discretion of the Principal.
- A special prize of Rs.500/- is awarded to the best N.C.C. Cadet, by the college.
- A special prize of Rs. 300/- is awarded to the best N.S.S. volunteer, by the college.
- The volunteers get additional 3% marks in seeking admission to PGDCA course.
- Youth leadership Award of Rs.1000/- for rendering distinguished social and national service.
- A maximum of 20 lectures will be given to students who participate in extra-curricular activities/sports at state/Panjab university level.
- 50% fee-concession will be offered to the handicapped students in all streams.

STUDENT COUNCIL

Elections will be held according to the guidelines of Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Some council members will be nominated on the basis of good conduct, academic performance and participation in co-curricular activities/ sports.

A student standing for any post of the Students' Council must fulfill the following conditions:

1. The student should possess leadership qualities and should be a good orator.
2. She should be obedient, well behaved and disciplined.
3. The student should have scored at least 50% marks in the Semester Examination in the previous year.
4. The student should have fulfilled all the conditions (Academic/Attendance laid down by the University)
5. The students should not have ever been involved in any act of misconduct, misbehaviour or fight etc.
6. Any student involved in any kind of anti institutional activities will be debarred from contesting the elections.
7. It will be obligatory for all the council members to participate actively in conducting/ organising all the college functions.
8. The council members will be awarded certificates only if their involvement in various college activities has been found to be satisfactory.

Elections for the following posts will be held:

President: to be elected from BA-III/ B.Com.-III/ BBA-III/BCA-III/B.Sc-III/MA (Eco)/ M.Com

Vice President : to be elected from B.Sc-II/ BA-II/BBA-II/ B.Com.-II/BCA-II/B.Voc II

Secretary : to be elected from BA-I/ B.Com.-I/ B.Sc-I/BCA-I/BBA-I/B.Voc-I/MA (Eco)-I/M.Com-I/Diploma

Jt. Secretary : to be elected from any class

Strict action will be taken against the students found guilty of damaging or defacing the college property.





COLLEGE RULES

All undergraduate and postgraduate Classes have Semester System

EXAMINATION

- Mid Semester Test will be conducted in September and March.

Qualifying Marks

25% in aggregate in Mid Semester Tests.

1. Any student held guilty of using unfair means shall be heavily fined or in case of gross misconduct may even be expelled from the college.
2. Permission to be absent from the examination shall not be granted except in very emergent and genuine cases like self-illness etc. which may be supported by a documentary evidence and submitted within three days of the examination.
3. Absence from an examination for whatever reason means nil result. Absence from an examination will entail a fine of Rs. 25/- per paper.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Theory Papers : 10% in all subjects based on Mid Semester Test.

Practical Examination : As per Panjab University norms.

Important

- Absence/failure in House Examination or Mid Semester Test may disqualify a student from appearing as a regular college student in the University Examination.
- Students who miss the examination while representing college in sports or cultural events are allowed to appear in the special test. The participating students must send an application duly signed by the

Lecturer Incharge to the Controller of Examinations.

- No special test will be held to clear the eligibility condition.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RULES

The semester examination will be conducted by the Panjab University in December (1st, 3rd and 5th Semester) and May (2nd, 4th and 6th Semester).

A student will be eligible to appear in this examination as a regular student of this college only if she has:

- i) Remained on the rolls of the college for the academic year preceding the examination.
- ii) Attended not less than 75 percent of the total number of lectures delivered in all the subjects offered.
- iii) Obtained at least 25 percent marks in the aggregate of all the subjects in Mid Semester Test.
- iv) In case of BBA and BCA the condition is at least 40% in the aggregate.

Students with practical subjects/BBA can not appear privately. Such students who do not qualify Mid Semester Test would be detained for the year.

LEAVE RULES

For leave from the college, the following rules should be strictly followed by the students.

- i) Leave up to two days is granted by the subject teachers and for more than that by the senior tutor on the recommendation of the subject teachers.

- ii) Application for leave must be signed by the father/guardian of the student. In case of illness, the application should be accompanied by a medical certificate. No medical leave will be sanctioned after a week.
- iii) Students absent from college without permission will be fined Rs.5/- per period and Rs. 5/- for the whole day.
- iv) Leave application does not imply granting of lectures for the number of days the student is on leave.
- v) If a student remains absent without leave continuously for fifteen days her name will be struck off from the college rolls.
- vi) The maximum leave allowed to a student during an academic year will be 15 days only. Extra leave shall be automatically cancelled and considered as absence.

DISCIPLINE RULES

Each student will adhere to the following rules of discipline:

1. Ragging is strictly prohibited, punishable by law.
2. Every student should bring her Identity-cum-Library Card to the college daily.
3. Attendance of every student at all college functions is compulsory. Absence from these may cause her to pay a fine upto Rs. 50.
4. Any serious violation of the above mentioned discipline rules can lead to punishment such as heavy fine, withdrawal of concessions/ stipends or even expulsion from the college in the extreme cases.
5. Wearing of HELMETS is compulsory for students coming on two-wheelers.
6. **MOBILE PHONES ARE NOT TO BE USED INSIDE THE CLASSROOMS.**
7. Consumption of non-veg food or any kind of intoxicant is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
8. The students coming to the college on a four wheeler with a driver will not be allowed to park their vehicles in the college premises.

MIGRATION RULES

Migration certificate from all recognized boards must be submitted in the college office within 15 days from the date of admission. Migration of students from a college affiliated to any one of the statutory Universities (Indian) to a college affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, is allowed on the following conditions:

LEAVE RULES FOR SPORTS STUDENTS

1. Any member of the sports wing found absent continuously for one week without prior permission of the Principal would not only lose the seat in the wing but it would also entail the cancellation of their admission.
2. Free hostel facility will be withdrawn from sports students who do not attend the classes after the tournament is over.
3. The players participating in the university tournaments are required to attend minimum 50% lectures in each subject during their stay in the college.
4. A failed student is not eligible for sports facility during the next academic session.
1. Certificate of the lower examination passed.
2. Lecture statement from the college she migrates from in the middle of the session.
3. Migration of a student from a professional college to an Arts or Science College and vice-versa is not permissible.
4. A migration fee and an eligibility fee shall be charged from every student coming from another university.
5. Migration will not be permitted if the combination of the subjects offered by the students does not tally with the combination of the subjects allowed in this college.
6. When the migration of a student has been allowed, she must join the new college within 15 days, otherwise her migration shall be considered as cancelled.
7. Local Migration of a student shall be allowed only for valid reasons.

Compartment/Reappear cases of other Universities

A student of any other university who is placed in compartment/reappear in 1st year/2nd year of BA/B.Com/BBA/B.Sc.course is not allowed to join the 2nd/3rd year course of this University.

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

A student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the principal and the application must be countersigned by her father or guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until she has cleared all her college dues.
