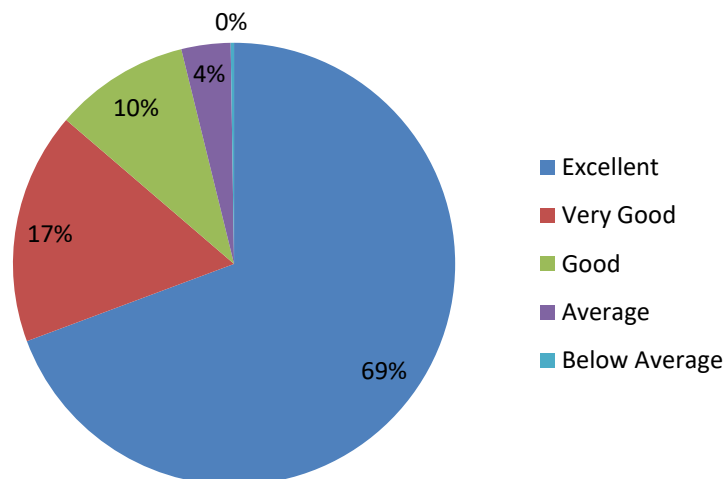
Feedback analysis report: 2019-2020

The feedback is collected from students, teachers' and alumni about the curriculum and facilities available in the college. Feedback from the students about college infrastructure, Non-teaching staff and their respective subject teachers is also collected. The data collected from both students and teachers' through comprehensive questionnaire is analyzed and summarized below:

Feedback from students about teachers Performance

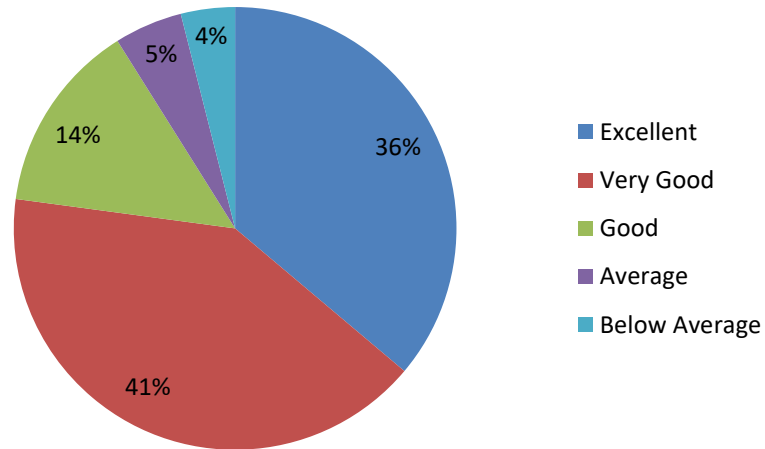
Feedback from students about their subject teachers is collected and their performance is analyzed on the basis of their performance on time sense, subject command, use of teaching methods and their helping attitude towards students.

Teachers' Performance in Time Sense



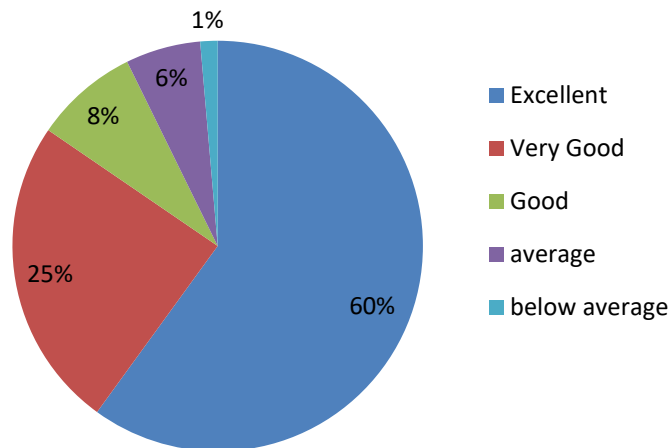
- The responses from the students show that teachers were punctual in their classes and they complete their syllabus on time. Most of the teachers, around 96% are regular in their classes and also arrange class test, quizzes and seminars regularly to develop and enhance problem solving skills in students.

Teachers' Performance on Subject Command



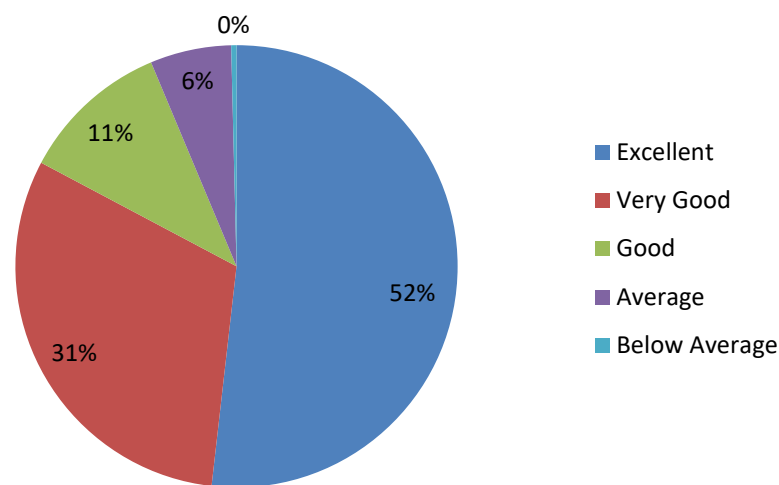
- Majority of the students (around 91%) agree that the teachers delivered their lectures as per the syllabi and had good communication skills with high self-confidence. Their lectures were properly structured and they created interest in the subject by quoting life experiences and examples.

Teachers' Performance on the use of Innovative Teaching Methods



- Most of the students (93%) found that use of power point presentation, models and videos by teachers made the teaching more interesting and helped in better understanding of subject. The teachers finished their mid semester evaluation on time and had shown the answer sheets to students. Teachers also addressed the students problems related to understanding of question paper during exams and taught them how to attempt the question paper.

Teachers' Performance on their Helping Attitude towards Students

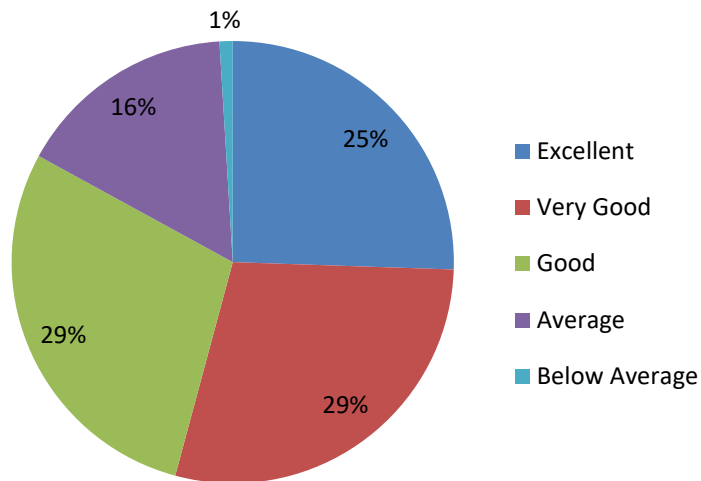


- Students found that most of the teachers (94%) had provided them the study materials which were not available in text books through e-resources, e-journals, reference books and open courses etc. Teachers also helped students to overcome the physical, emotional and learning challenges.

Feedback from students about college

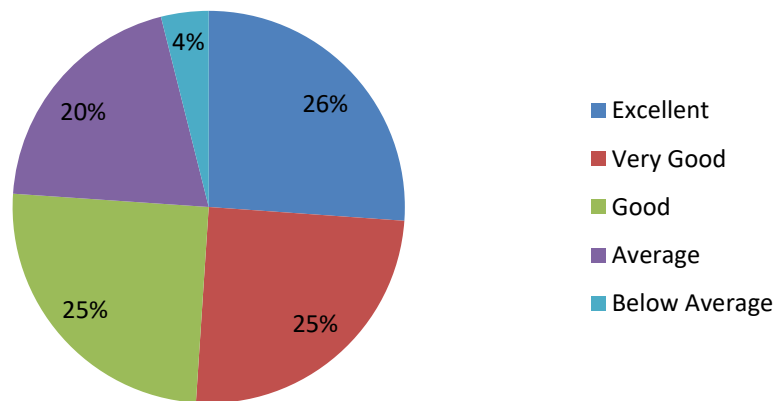
Feedback from the students about college infrastructure, library and office staff is collected regularly, so, that relevant improvements suggested by them can be made in the college.

Helping attitude of Library and non-teaching staff



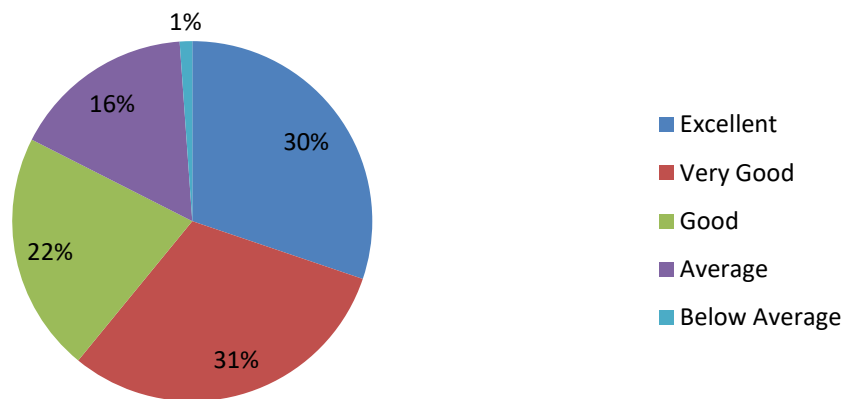
- Around 83% of students found office and library staff cooperative and helpful. Only few of them had problems with the dealing of office staff. So based on that, office and library staff was advised to be more humble and polite.

Internet Facility



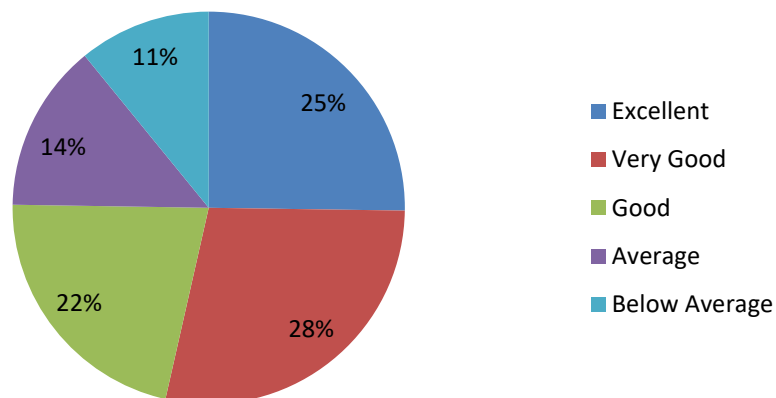
- The students were satisfied with the internet facility provided in the College. They had good access of internet in the college library and UGC resource center. Only few had issues with the interned facilities. Based upon their problems, college had upgraded the internet facility for higher internet speed.

- Most of the students were satisfied with the available books in the library. But there were also suggestions to add new books editions in the library. Accordingly, new books are purchased in the library every year as per students’ suggestions and teachers’ recommendations.

Drinking Water, Cleanliness and Greenary in Campus

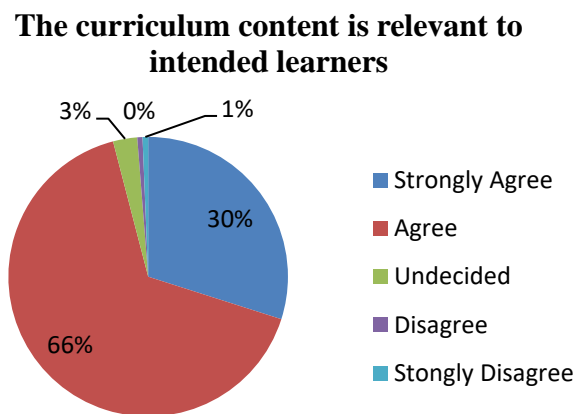


- The students found the college campus green and eco-friendly. Although, few of students complaint about the clean drinking water and cleanliness of washrooms.

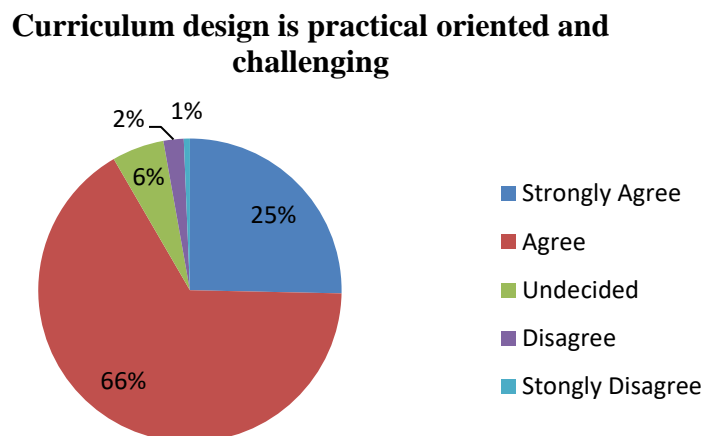
Accordingly, the washrooms were renovated and it is now ensured that toilets are cleaner and water coolers are cleaned and repaired on regular basis.

The feedback form the students about their respective course content are collected and analyzed to take their point of view. The collected data and its analysis is given below:



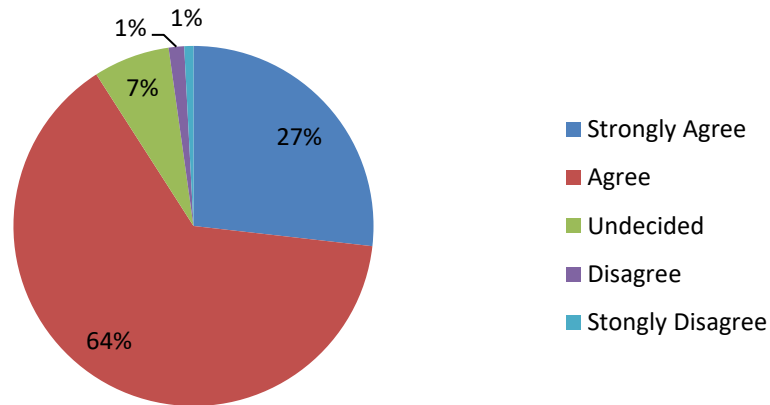
- Around 96% students found that curriculum is appropriate as per their course objectives. The course content provides them in depth knowledge about the course and is suitable for their future studies and job options.



- Most of the students, around 91% have agreed with the fact the curriculum design of their respective course is practical oriented and provides them practical exposure

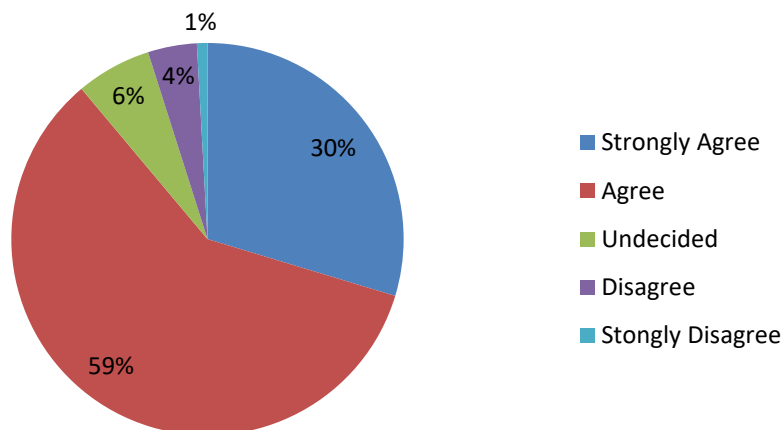
along with the theoretical concept. Most of the students also find the course content challenging for the new learners.

The curriculum is relevant to the regional/national developmental needs



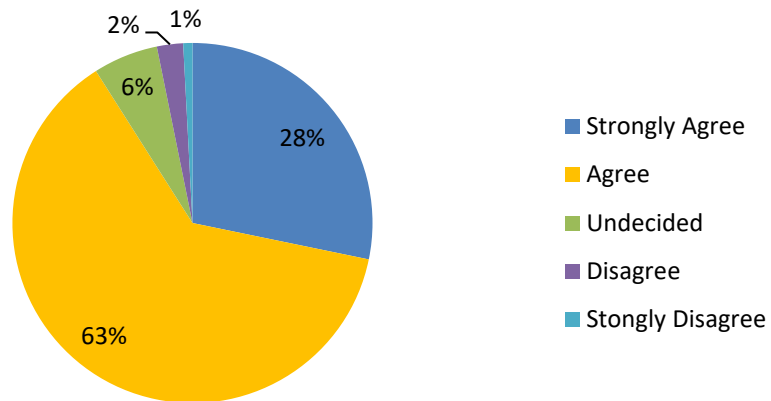
- 91% of the students do agree that course content is designed in such a way that it meets all the regional/national development needs. It strengthens the knowledge of students theoretically and practically and prepares them for future regional/national requirements.

The curriculum provides interdisciplinary knowledge



- Most of the students do agree that curriculum provides them interdisciplinary knowledge. Only few of them around 11% demand to modify the syllabus in such a way that it helps to strengthen their interdisciplinary skills.

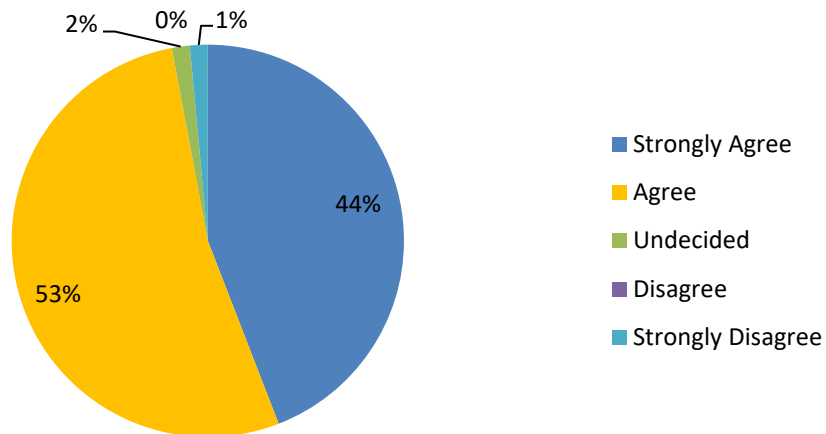
The curriculum provides adequate time and provision for exploratory activities



- The positive response from around 91% students clearly indicates that they got sufficient time along with their studies for extracurricular activities. They can enhance their creative skills along with their studies.

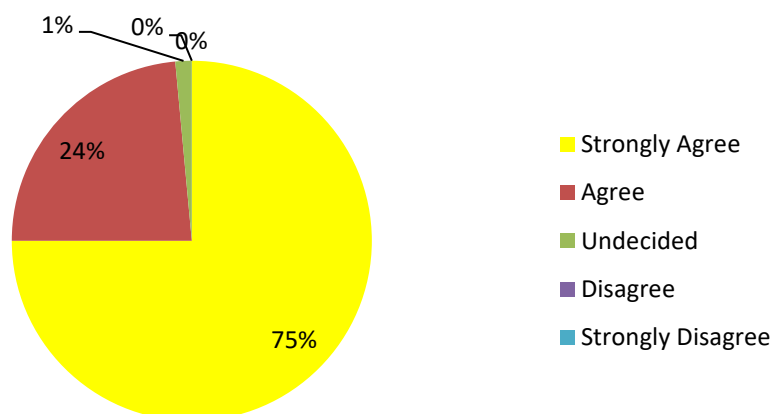
Feedback from Teachers' about Curriculum

The curriculum content is relevant to intended learners



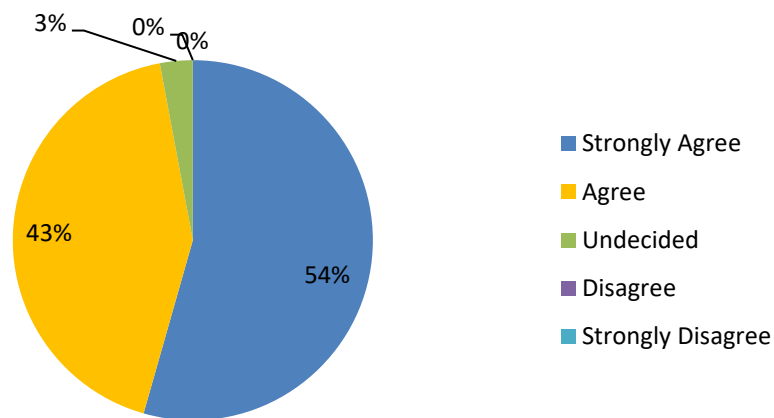
- Around 97% of teachers have found that the present curriculum of the respected courses is relevant to the course learners. Only 3% have recommended few changes in the curriculum to make it more appropriate for the students.

The physical facilities like class rooms, lab equipment and ICT are sufficient



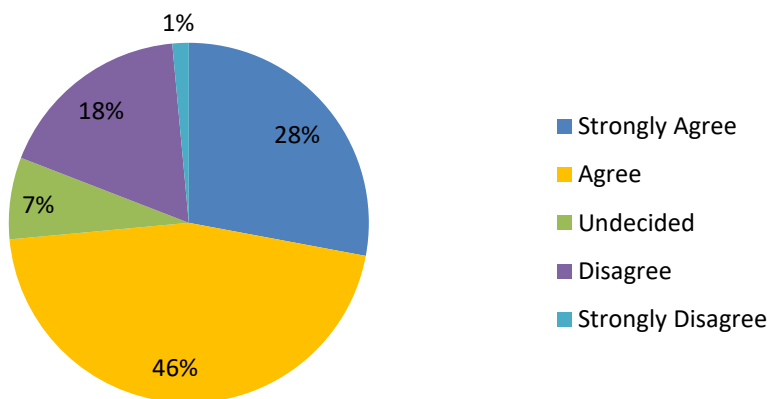
- Around 99% of teachers strongly agree with the fact that lab facilities and ICT are sufficient in the college. Only 1% faculty members have an opinion that more classrooms and ICT facilities are required in the college.

Adequate number of books, journals and e-learning resources are available in library.



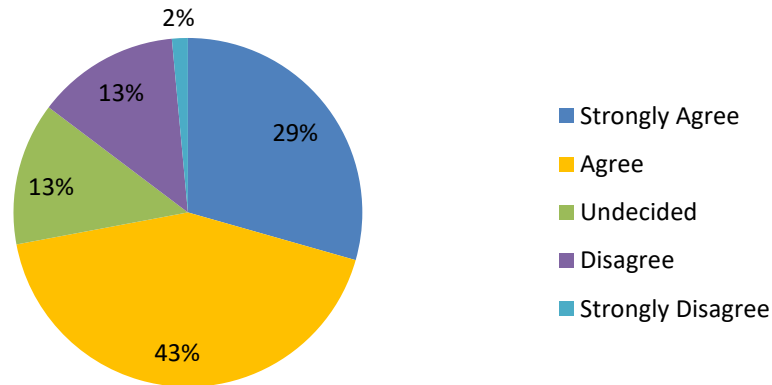
- Most of the faculty members around 97% are satisfied with the books and e-resources available in the library. But still every year new books editions are added in the library to keep resources updated.

Curriculum design is practical oriented and challenging.



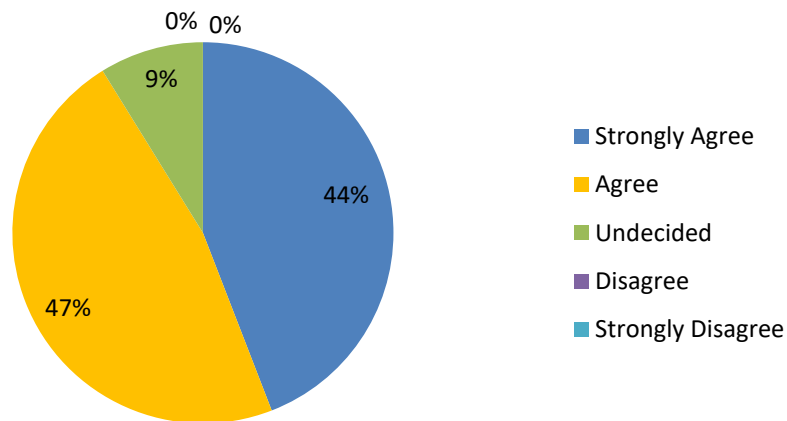
- The faculty members found that curriculum is designed in such a way that it is practically oriented but few of them around 18% do want that syllabus should be more practical oriented.

Curriculum is relevant to the regional/national developmental needs



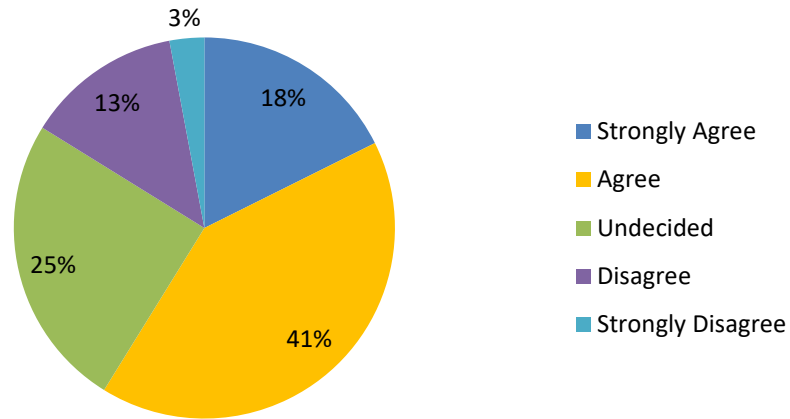

Student's grievances regarding evaluation results are addressed



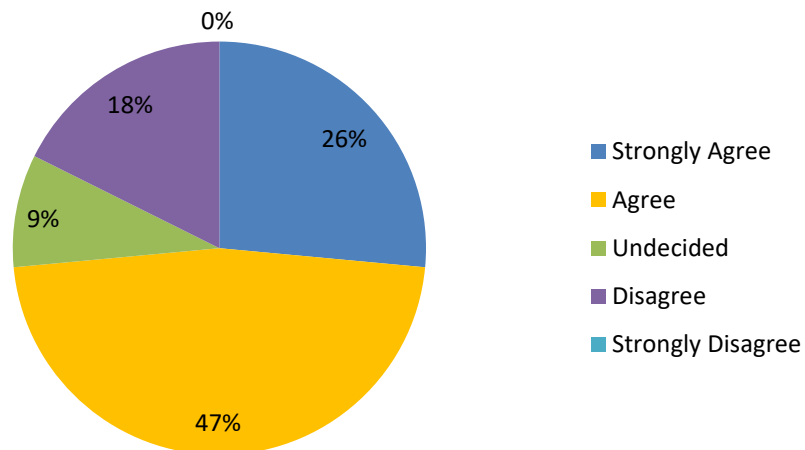
- The students grievances regarding evaluation of results are properly readressed. If any fault is found then proper representation from student side approved by the college authorities is sent to university for necessary actions.

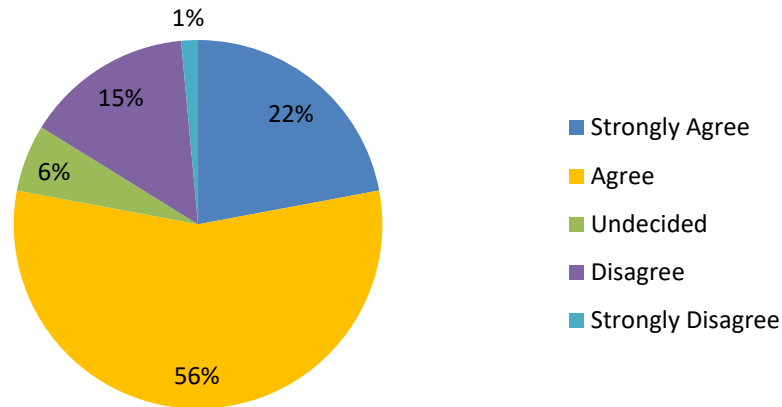
Curriculum provides inter-disciplinary knowledge

- Most of the faculty members do agree that curriculum provides sufficient opportunities and time for exploratory activities. There is sufficient time in the semester except regular classes in which students can participate in extracurricular activities.
